MarylandRxCard.com	Maryland Rx Card is a free statewide prescription assistance program open to anyone regardless of age or income There are no forms to fill out and no restrictions on membership. Create and print your FREE discount prescription drug card on the website. This card will provide you with Rx medication savings of up to 75% at more than 56,000 pharmacies across the country including Safeway, Giant, Martin's, CVS/pharmacy, Kmart, Harris Teeter, Super Fresh, Target, Walgreens, and many more. Partnership for Prescription Assistance	The Partnership for Prescription Assistance helps qualifying patients without prescription drug coverage get the medicines they need through the program that is right for them. Many will get their medications free or nearly free.	A user-friendly Web site (www.pparx.org) enables patients to find programs for which they may be eligible to apply. Patients can call toll free (I-888-4PPA-NOW) to talk with a trained specialist who will guide them through the application process. The call centers accepts calls in English, Spanish and approximately 150 other languages.
NeedyMeds	NeedyMeds is an online information resource of programs that provide assistance to people who are unable to afford their medications and health care costs. NeedyMeds offers up-to-date applications and information so that you can apply directly to drug manufacturers and other organizations that provide assistance.
